# HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY OF NEW SOUTH WALES

(Visit of H.R.H. Prince Alfred) 1868. BY L. J. CARLISLE

The early history of Agricultural, Horticultural and Scientific activities in New South Wales is often interwoven with individual and dual Societies. A listing of these Societies shows various dates of activities.

- 1. The Agricultural Society of New South Wales. 5th July 1822 22nd Feb. 1836.
- Philosophical Society of Australia. Dec. 1821.
- The Agricultural & Horticultural Society of N.S.W. 22nd Feb. 1836-
- The Australian Society to promote the growth and consumption of Colonial produce and manufactures. 1830-1836.
- The Australian Floral and Horticultural Society (Sometimes known as Sydney Hort. Society) 1836-1848.
- The Australasian Botanic and Horticultural Society. 20th June 1848 – 8 Dec. 1856.
- 7. The Australian Philosophical Society. 19th Jan. 1850-
- The Horticultural Improvement Society of N.S.W. 15th Jan. 1855 – 8 Dec. 1856.
- 9. The Australian Horticultural and Agricultural Soc. 8th Dec. 1856.
- The Agricultural Society of New South Wales. Reformed 1868.

These early Societies had been started and promoted by prominent citizens of New South Wales to foster and promote the importance of Agriculture and Horticulture to the early Colony.

The Floral and Horticultural Society was formed in Sydney in 1836 after the faltering of the Agricultural Society of New South Wales, which had begun at Parramatta in 1822. The Floral and Horticultural Society, also at Parramatta, had its first show in September 1838, showing flowers, vegetables and plants.

The revival of the Agricultural Society of New South Wales began in the late 1860's when they attempted to organise a show at Parramatta for March 1868 to commemorate the visit to Sydney of Prince Alfred, Duke of Edinburgh. This was not achieved and it was left to the Horticultural Society to make an Exhibition in the Botanical Gardens on the

29th, 30th, 31st January and 1st February 1868. The time chosen being too late for Spring blossom, brought the display of many ferns and shrubs instead. As there was no Agricultural show, it was decided to include displays of this nature, as will be shown by the prizes listed below.

The committee formed to manage this large Exhibition was entrusted to Messrs. Crichton, Graham, Parcel, Wooff, Johns, Henderson and T. S. Glaister.

The unique prize medals to be given for 1st and 2nd were to be struck in silver and bronze respectively, the preparation of which was given to Mr. T. S. Glaister and Mr. Luke Wooff. Mr. J. C. Thornthwaite was contracted by them to design the medal which was later struck at the Sydney Mint.

The obverse shows the Staghorn Fern with "HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY NEW SOUTH WALES" around "PERISTERE.EST PROSPERARE" across in Latin (To persevere is to succeed) "THORN-THWAITE SYDNEY". The reverse shows a wreath design of leaves, buds and flowers and the words "PRESENTED TO" in the centre. Around the border are the words "TO COMMEMORATE THE VISIT OF H.R.H. PRINCE ALFRED DUKE OF EDINBURGH K.G. TO SYDNEY 1868".

On close scrutiny of both obverse and reverse it will be seen that Thornthwaite has recut both dies, as many faint underlying letters show in the field of the medal. Also the date 1868 shows the last figure "8" to have been cut over the figure "7". This, I believe was caused by the rescheduling of the Springtime Exhibition that would have normally been held in October, being delayed to coincide with the Duke's visit in January 1868. It is also recorded that the next Horticultural show was held in the October of 1868, using a similar obverse medal design but a totally new die. The reverse is also a new design, omitting "TO COMMEMORATE" etc, with the date being inscribed.

In my book on "Australian Commemorative Medals and Medalets from 1788" I quote the

mintage as recorded in an article in "The Queenslander" newspaper by Dr. Roth as 100 Copper, 50 Silver and 1 Gold. I have since found recorded in the Horticultural Magazine and Gardeners Calendar of New South Wales" (No. 51 March 1868 Vol. V.), which gives a full list of the medal winners as I Gold to His Royal Highness, Prince of Wales, 52 Silver and 29 Copper presented in the January with the "Commemorative" obverse. Also, in the October 1868 Exhibition, with the altered design, there were only 12 Silver and 8 Bronze issued as recorded in the May 1869 issue of the same magazine. The discrepancy in these figures may be accounted for in the fact that there are some medals seen without inscription.

The January Exhibition was duly arranged in a 240 foot marquee, and long before the appointed time for the arrival of H.R.H. The Duke of Edinburgh, the fashionable company had assembled at the Botanic Gardens. The day was to be marred by frequent rain, causing a hurried entrance by the Duke out of a private entrance from Government House. He was escorted through the Exhibition by His Excellency The Earl of Belmore, Mr. T. S. Mort president of the Society, Mr. H. Prince, Mr. J. R. Young, Mr. Joseph Thompson, and the Mayor of Sydney. The musical arrangements for the day were supplied by the band of H. M. 50th Regiment and Volunteer Rifle Corps.

The medal shown here is to Mr. Joseph Thompson for a display by Mr. Draper, his gardener: "In Mr. Draper's collection were some good plants of Fuchsias, Begonias, Tydeas, Ferns, Hoya variegata, Caladiums, Petunias, Liliums, Hibiscus, Guilfoylii, Meyenia erecta etc. This was a very creditable collection, but unfortunately were so crowded that their relative beauties were in a measure hid. They received an award of a Bronze medal. but were no doubt worthy of a higher award". (Judges report)

As well as the medallic prizes there were Schedule Prizes of monetary reward for 1st and 2nd prizes and Honorable Mentions.

The account for the medals for the Commemorative issue was recorded:

Gold medal to H.R.H. Prince Alfred = £20-0-0
Royal Mint for medals = 25-12-3
Cases. = 9-8-4
Leigh & Co. for engraving medals = 3-10-0

The October 1868 Exhibition was also held in the lower Botanic Gardens in fine weather, which helped to make it a financial success. It was held over a two day period, 21st-22nd October, with the notable attendance of the Governor His Excellency the Earl and Countess of Belmore.
